# BIVSP 2018 Application Process

**2018 Application deadline - October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017**



The application package must use the new **BI template** and must include:

- One application signed by the Dean or Associate Dean of Research of the college.
- Each application for funding must be **no more than three pages** in length and include the objective, program description, process and budget.
- All colleges that have been funded in **2017** must submit a **2017** program review at the time of **2018** funding application.

# 2018 Program Guidelines

Programs will be evaluated based on the following guidelines:

**40%**

2017 Program Review (if applicable)  
Host school website review  
Research Scholars tracking information

**60%**

2018 Program Proposal:  
(research; seminar program and extracurricular activities)

# Application Timeline

**September 4, 2017:** Invitation for 2018 applications

**October 31, 2017:** **Deadline for 2018 BIVSP applications**

**January 11, 2018:** Schools notified of funding status via email

**January 22, 2018:** Post program on the BIVSP website

**April 17, 2018:** 2018 funding circulated
